The institute is a public-private partnership of business, labour, government and higher education that works to support the economic vitality and competitiveness of California and the Bay Area.

According to the 300-page report, the research institutions and technology companies in Silicon Valley and its risk-taking culture will work better when juxtaposed with Indian talent and entrepreneurial energy.

However, the council warned that the present visa and immigration policies of the US restricted access to global talent.

> "US visa and immigration policy unnecessarily restricts access to global talent, fails to compete aggressively for top foreign students and researchers, and discourages them from staying to contribute to the economy," said the report.

This leads students and recent immi-

grants to return home, especially at a juncture when India is no more a destination for lower-endwork as against the innovation streams in the Valley, it added.

The council also said the Bay Area was now working on plans to create stronger ties between Silicon Valley and cities like Bangalore.

The India report is the second in a series that explores the Bay Area's ties with emerging economic giants. The first one related to the region's strong links with China.

### **Reliance Big Inks Deal With Hollywood Filmmakers**

Titled Creative Partnerships, the deal was brokered by Creative Artists Agency, a prominent entertainment and sports agency headquartered in Los Angeles.

## Manmohan's US Visit Renewed Commitment **To Strategic Partnership: Meera Shankar**

Washington: (IANS) With Prime Minister Manmohan Singh's US visit renewing the two governments' commitment to the India-US strategic partnership, they will work together to advance global stability, security and sustainable development, according to the Indian envoy here.

The visit last week, "we believe, has renewed the commitment of the two governments to this partnership and has laid the foundation for strengthening cooperation across the extraordinary breadth of our bilateral engagement", Indian ambassador to the US Meera Shankar said recently

"They also agreed on expeditious comple-



tion of the remaining steps in the implementation of the civil nuclear agreement, which will open enormous opportunities for boosting economic ties and addressing the shared concerns on energy security and climate change,"

she said in a speech at the University of Virginia, Charlottesville.

"The ongoing transformation of the Indian economy provides new avenues to strengthen her economic engagement with the US in ways that advance the economic welfare of our people and puts our economies on a more sustainable path," added Shankar, speaking on "India and the United States - A Growing Partnership.'

"But, beyond that, we will work together to

security and sustainable development as we respond to the opportunities and challenges of our shared world," she said adding:

"This is a relationship, which can be, as President Obama said, one of the defining relationships of the 21st century."

Obama and Manmohan Singh also "discussed avenues for working together to accelerate global economic recovery and to put it on a more sustainable and balanced path in the future" besides issues of security, stability and economic cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region. Shankar said.

"The elimination of terror-

ist safe havens and sanctuaries in Pakistan and Afghanistan is not only vital for security and stability in our region, it is also vital for making our world a safer place," she said.

"India and the United States have transformed their relationship, building and deepening cooperation across a very wide field, redefining paradigms and turning constraints of the past into opportunities for the future," Shankar said.

"India's ties with the United States have emerged as one of our most comprehensive partnerships, nurment between the govern-

ments, but also by the vitality of our fast expanding private partnerships and warmth of ties between our peoples.'

"A new element is the growth in Indian investments into the United States. In fact, on the basis of annual flows, Indian FDI in the US has exceeded US foreign direct investment into India in recent years in diverse sectors," she noted.
