

Create Jobs In America, Get A Green Card!

Washington: (IANS) Backed by over 160 venture capitalists, including several Indian Americans, two US senators have introduced a bill to give fast track visas to immigrant entrepreneurs in return for creating jobs to increase America's global competitiveness.

The StartUp Visa Act of 2010 will allow an immigrant entrepreneur to receive a two year visa if he or she can show that a qualified US investor is willing to dedicate a significant sum - a minimum of \$250,000 - to the immigrant's startup venture.

"Global competition for talent and investment grows more intense daily and the United States must step up or be left behind," said John Kerry Democratic chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, who introduced the bill with Richard Lugar, top Republican on the panel.

"Creating a new magnet for innovations and innovators to come to the United States and create jobs here will offer our economy a double shot in

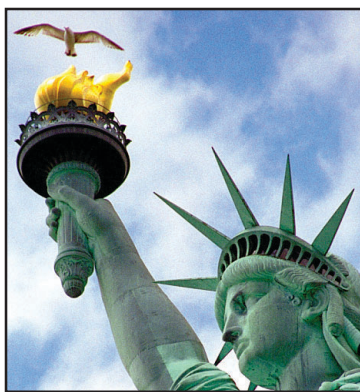
the arm - robust job creation at home and reaffirmation that we're the world's best place to do business," Kerry said.

"Our country should strive to attract to the United States the most talented and highly skilled entrepreneurs," said Lugar.

The StartUp Visa Act of 2010 would amend immigration law to create a new EB-6 category for immigrant entrepreneurs, drawing from existing visas under the EB-5 category, which permits foreign nationals who invest at least \$1 million into the US, and thereby create ten jobs, to obtain a green card.

After proving that he or she has secured initial investment capital and if, after two years, the immigrant entrepreneur can show that he or she has generated at least five full-time jobs in the United States, attracted \$1 million in additional investment capital or achieved \$1 million in revenue, then he or she would receive permanent legal resident status.

Samurai Swordsman: Former Tech Student Attacks Two

Atlanta: Kshitij Shrotri, 32, a former Georgia Tech graduate with a doctorate in aerospace engineering was charged with aggravated assault for allegedly attacking Samer Tawfik, 39, with a samurai sword at the Weber Space Science and Technology Building on the Tech campus. Tawfik, who is from Egypt, is a post-doctoral research fellow in the School of Aerospace Engineering.

Shrotri, was reportedly quickly subdued by Georgia Tech police officers, one of whom was injured during the arrest. The victims were immediately taken to Grady Hospital where they were reported to be in stable condition, a day after the incident in February.

Shrotri is being held without bond in the Fulton County Jail. According to police reports, when officers confronted Shrotri in Tawfik's cubicle and demanded he drop his weapon he said, "You

will have to kill me." He added, "He ruined my life." Tawfik lay on the ground behind his desk when officers arrived. After multiple warnings, officers sprayed Shrotri with pepper spray and pinned him against a bookshelf.

The attack was allegedly over a woman, reports AJC. A few months ago at a dance on campus, Shrotri, became furious when he saw a woman he liked dancing close to Tawfik. Shrotri reportedly yelled at Tawfik and pushed him several times, according to a Georgia Tech police report. The woman considered filing a protection order against Shrotri, but decided that would only aggravate him. AJC further reports that the police and the Tech dean's office asked Shrotri to stay away from the woman, and he agreed.

Shrotri received his PhD in aerospace engineering from Georgia Tech in 2008, and later moved to Delaware.
